## 3. Reports from Council

#### a. Parent Engagement Report - Ashley Wilford-Matthews

 Parent Engagement Sessions - Had two parent engagement sessions in December. We had Mr. Pickle (Gord Hamilton), who went through some of the math games that he brought into the Westmount classrooms. Parents were really engaged. There were ~65 parents at that event. Next, we had Jill Foreman, who is an occupational therapist. We've had a number of sessions with Jill Foreman before. Jill talked about parenting strategies, mental health and executive function. Paul Davis came in on January 10<sup>th</sup> to discuss digital safety and social media. He also spent the days running a session with the students.

## a. Elementary Campus Update - Hal Curties

- Lunar New Year Year of the Rabbit. People born in the Year of the Rabbit are calm and peaceful.
- Elementary Campus January theme is respect. Encourage parents to look for opportunities in the home to show respect. Great book to read is "Do Unto Otters". This segue into DEI conversations. Make sure that everyone is being represented in the materials. Feed the city challenge was a success. 2,500lbs of food and \$3,000 in cash raised. Thank you to all parents for their generosity. Had mountains of chocolates and goodies before Christmas. Report Cards will be coming out on January 31st.
- **Mad Science** Thank you to all of the parents for their donations. We were able to bring Mad Science in for all of our classes.
- Coffee Talks Next coffee will be Friday February 10<sup>th</sup>. Dr. Hood our new superintendent will be in attendance.
- Drama Run by our TLAs. Starts September and ends in June. Mostly involves students with learning disabilities.
- Parent Teacher Conferences took place in November and we have another set in February. Based on the parent survey, the amount of online vs. in person is about right. Lots of parent satisfaction with those meetings.
- Intake Normally, we would have potential candidates into our school at the end of January. Due to increase in illnesses, we will not be doing that this year
- Professional Development Started year off with professional development with Dr. Bruce Shore. Thank you to School Council for providing the funds to make that possible.

#### b. Mid-High Campus Update - Graeme Finlay

- Article Talk One of the administration's committees is focused on gifted research. Part of that involves looking at articles on giftedness. In the Mid-High report there are two good articles. One article is about intelligence and giftedness and how students associate being smart as being gifted, which is not true
- Exam Schedule Currently in exam break for high school (Grades 9 to 12). School is still open to high school students. Teachers are available for drop-in. Suggest that students email teachers first if they want to drop-in
- **Reregistration** Reregistration for current students for both campuses is a twostep process. First step is an intent to register and a deposit. Step one has to be complete by February 3<sup>rd</sup>. Once you pay the deposit you will be sent out a package. The deposit is \$100 per child. Also, you can't have any outstanding dues.
- Intake Applications for Mid-high are still open until the 15th. Website has all of the information.
- Art Curator Still looking for art curator. Want to turn learning commons into somewhere they can showcase that stuff. Simon Corrin is willing to help out with digital. Absolutely phenomenal what the students are creating.

#### Question (Roti): Is there any interest in monetizing the work?

Not really crossed my mind. Historically, we might take some of the art to decorate cards for a fundraiser. Typically, we avoid things for profit.

## 5. Administration Diversity, Equity & Inclusion ("DEI")

- Administration had a senior leadership meeting with the superintendent. Will meet as the Executive DEI council. Will decide how to move forward from there.
- Last year a "state of Westmount" was completed by the administration to look at the representation and diversity of the staff. One of the open conversations is the demographics of the students. One of the things we will do is a survey to create baseline data. Would like a thoughtful and well worded survey.
- In addition to the Executive DEI council there is also a Student DEI council and Staff DEI council. Student DEI has been doing discussions through STS, setup presentations and organize event. Currently doing work around Black History month. Looking to perhaps run basketball tournament to raise money to support different communities. Considering bringing guest speakers for Black History month
- Staff DEI engaging staff in more conversation. Will pick an article/topic and invite staff members to the conversations. Have done one or two so far this year. During the past 18 months the administration started looking at diversifying the at literature.
