# 3. Student Council Report - President Jun Heo

- Students are pleasantly surprised as restrictions are being lifted and activities are being planned (i.e. Graduation). Majority of students are masking up and respecting each other's boundaries. # 4. Reports from Council

#### a) Parent Engagement Report - Ashley Wilford-Matthews

- **Coffee Talks** Feedback from parents is they like the online format. Have had great turnout for both the Elementary and Mid-High campuses. Lots of good discussion about restrictions. Have a coffee talk for the elementary campus this Friday. The Mid-High coffee talk is delayed to March 17<sup>th</sup> due to Spring break.
- Parent Engagement Sessions Talking to the U of C, with the Alberta Civil Liberties
  Research Center, about anti-racism education. Important that students are hearing
  similar message at home and in the school.

## b) Fundraising Report - Kim Anthony

- **Bottle Drive** Next one scheduled for April 28<sup>th</sup>. You can also setup Skip TheDepot pickup at your house
- **Stampeder Parking** First pre-season game is May the 28<sup>th</sup>. Will be in touch closer to the date to recruit volunteers.
- **Westmount Cookbook** Still have a few available. Contact Laura Teterenko if you would like to purchase one.
- **WestJet & 50/50 Raffles** Currently organizing the raffle draw. No date has been set yet to start selling tickets. Raffle draw might be done at the May 11<sup>th</sup> AGM.
- **Direct Donations** Thank you to everyone that has donated. Donations can happen all year round. This year funds are going to parent education, enhancement of the student experience and busing and other worth initiatives
- This year the Fundraising Director spot will be opening up, so anyone interested in volunteering for the role let us know before the AGM in May

# c) Treasurer's Report - Navdeep Kailey

- Revenue for March We had the cookbook fundraiser for a total of \$3,198. Year-to-date revenue is at \$18,901 vs budget of \$33,500
- Council Expenses For expense we had our Zoom annual subscription and the cost
  of the cookbooks. The total costs were \$1,300. School admin has submitted their
  invoices. Ballpark number is \$10,000 to \$15,000, exact numbers will be given in next
  report
- Total balance as of March 31 ~\$76,000

# 5. Principals' Reports - Mr. Hal Curties and Mr. Graeme Finley

EC Principal's Report Mid-High Principal's Report

#### a) Elementary Campus Update

- Report is primarily around the changing of the campus as a result of the relaxing of the pandemic restrictions. Masks are no longer required at the Elementary campus. Mask usage is about 60-65% at the campus. Asking parents still use the daily screening. Children that show symptoms will still go to the infirmary and parents will be asked to pick them up.
- Clubs Now able to resume clubs. Haven't had clubs in two years.
- Cohorting Home rooms are no longer cohorting, which means they do not have to strictly stay in their home room group. That means classes can go of field trips. Will not be regrouping for Math and Language Arts until the next school year. Would take too long to get that setup for this school year. Carpets can be brought back into the classroom, which is a big part of the elementary experience
- DPA Daily physical activity will resume in the Dusty Rose Gym.
- Assemblies Will start having assemblies again. Realize that most students have never been in an assembly, so we will start slowly with small grade group assemblies before a whole school assembly. Had a parent survey about assemblies. Anxiety level is higher among parents vs. the students, but most people are excited for assemblies
- Volunteers Parents are able to volunteer again. If parents are volunteering, you will still need a police check and be vaccinated. The mandatory vaccination is based on the Charter Board policy.
- Attendance Attendance is back to normal. Averaging about 20 absent students a day, which is pretty normal.
- Safety drills Had a bad weather drill (tornado) last week. Students leave classroom and sit in the hallway.
- Outdoor skating Has been going on for the last two weeks.

#### b) Mid-High Campus Update (in addition to Principal's Report)

- Covid update around the Mid-High Campus. Biggest change is around lunch time. Previously, Grades 7 to 12 were in their classrooms. Now they can eat where they want, including the Learning Commons. Going back to pre-Covid before and after school. Doors open at 8 am and class will be open at 8:15. Students can stay in the school until 4pm. After the break we will look to move the Grades 5 & 6 back to the cafeteria.
- Clubs & Sports Clubs were previously separated between Grades 5 & 6 and Grades
   7 to 12. Now clubs will include all Grades

- Masks Asking parents to use the daily screening. Masks are no longer required at the Mid-High campus. Mask usage is about 75-80% at the campus. If people are feeling unwell, take the time to spend time away.
- Course Selection Just completed education session on course selection. All students will have their timetable before the Summer.
- **Intake** Received approximately 300 applications. Not adding a bubble this year, so a few spots per Grade.
- Other Events Diversity club held a Mardi Gras celebration. There was a pink shirt day for anti-bullying

# Question: Will there be a tour of the campus for the current Grade 4s?

Planning something in June, probably during exam break. In May there will be an information session for all families.

#### Question: Sibling priority around admissions?

Hal - Are not able to have a sibling policy at Westmount. We can factor siblings into an "Other Factors" category. Graeme - Not allowed on advice from the Human Rights Commission.

#### Question: Will there be a Mardi Gras night?

Ashley - Looking at doing something more school-wide possibility in the Spring, but it won't be the Mardi Gras that we have hosted in the past.
